# Chief's Report Emergency Services Division Chester Public Utility District For July 2022

- No update from Forest Service regarding the lease of 198 Main facility.
- Finalizing our Support Division administrative details. We have 22 part time / retired annuitant personnel that are available for large fire team activation and district program needs.
- Attended webinars with Kelly regarding the Ground Emergency Medical Transportation programs. In a nutshell, we are going to be submitting close-out report information for the past 4 ½ years that should generate reimbursement for our ambulance services. A "new" GEMT program will begin 1/1/23.
- Myself and staff participated in a walk thru orientation at Collins Pine mill. This is assisting in their fire brigade formation and updating our pre-plan of the facility.
- Continuing research and assistance on tax assessment and benefit assessment information.
- Working with Tehama County to modify our ambulance response area to remove areas of Lassen Park from our mutual aid ambulance response.
- Developing annexation and mitigation fees for our fire department regarding annexation of the properties into our district.
- Met with our community's Firewise program coordinators. They are looking for interested community members to join their committee.
- Have improved various administrative tasks relating to personnel and operational effectiveness. As we move forward, we are finding issues that need attention from both policy and implementation avenues.
- I have applied to be the custodian of records for our background check program. Also have applied for DMV pull notice program custodian with Kelly.
- Finalizing respirator fit testing program for our staff.
- Meeting regularly with the other fire chiefs and boards. We are coordinating programs (such as fit-testing) to maintain consistency between our basin departments.
- An emergency broadcast system for the Almanor basin should be operational by January 1 2023. This is a grant funded program that will transmit community messages on am 1700 radio frequency. More on this as the program is rolled out publicly.


