

**Chief's Report  
Emergency Services Division  
Chester Public Utility District  
For August 2022**

This past two weeks has been primarily focused on our provision of resources to fires out of our area. We currently have an engine deployed to the Mosquito incident near Forest hill, having just returned home from a deployment to the Mountain incident in Siskiyou County. We have misc. per diem employees that have been deployed similarly, one incident to another. Our Support Division employees are deployed (13 at last count) with various Incident Management Teams across the North State and into Southern Oregon.

For August:

- Still no update from Forest Service regarding the lease of 198 Main facility. I leave weekly contact messages with no response. I am sure my contacts are all on fire incidents throughout the state.
- Working with Collins Pine on their fire brigade formation. They had a fire at the mill last week and were able to suppress it themselves with the engine they purchased from us. A success story for certain!
- Continuing assistance on tax assessment and benefit assessment information.
- Our ambulance boundary revision for response into Tehama County is complete. The dispatch centers are inputting the revision information into their computer aided dispatch systems. This should complete the project and revise our ambulance response.
- Completed the annexation fee charge schedule and now am working on the fire mitigation fee schedule.
- Met with our community's Firewise program coordinators. Still in formation, but we did identify projects for future work. They are still seeking public participation on the firewise board of directors.
- Still improving various administrative tasks relating to personnel and operational effectiveness and identifying policies or practices that are needed. This is an ongoing task.

This will be my last report as Fire Chief to the board. I am thankful for the opportunity to serve our community and district in this interim position and look forward to my participation with the district in the future.

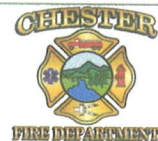

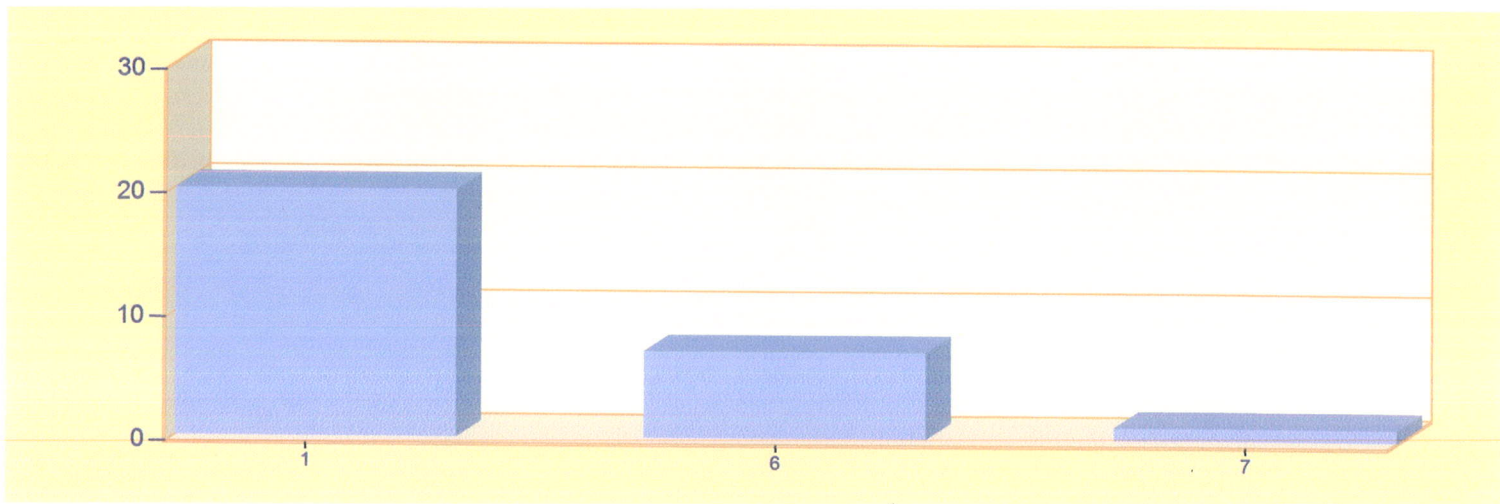

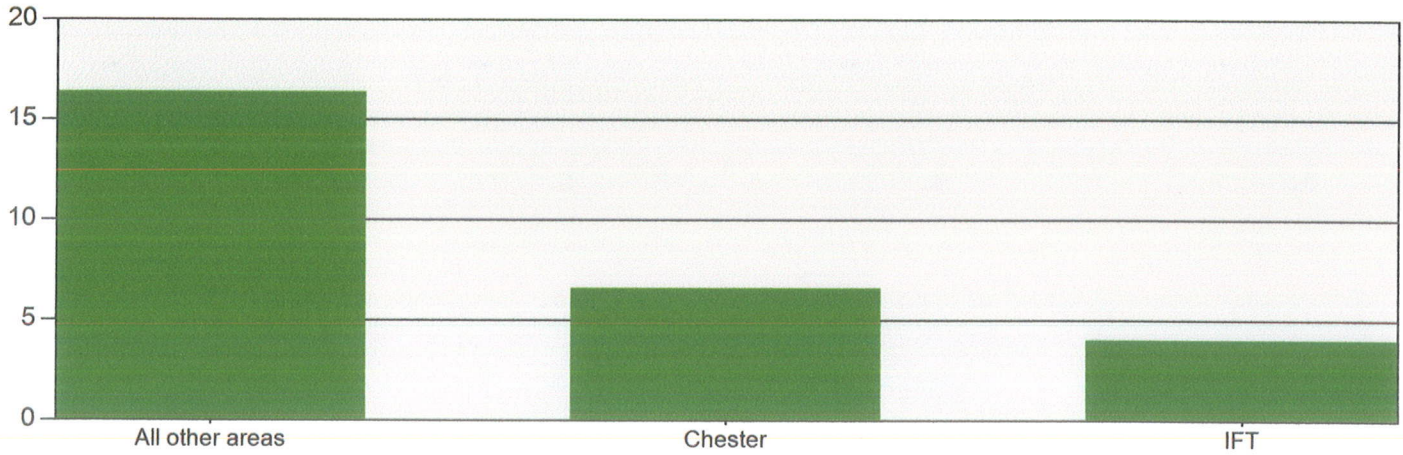
