- 12. Resolution #404: Increase Health Premiums Cap for Retirees: GM Motzkus stated that this needs to be amended, as the premiums have gone up. Director Voboril would like to see the policies and guidelines on this topic. Director Layne made a motion to approve the amendment to Res. 404, increasing the cap to \$2076.00. Director Thompson seconded the vote. Ayes votes; Directors Layne and Thompson. Nay vote, Director Voboril. Motion passes 2 to 1.
- **13. Resolution #406: PERS Retired Annuitant 180 Exception for Donald Stoner:** Director Layne stated this wasn't our business and we do not wasn't to start a president. Director Layne made a motion <u>not</u> to accept the Res. 406. Director Voboril seconded the motion to <u>disapprove</u> the Res. All in favor, motion carried.
- 14. Policy #4060 Committees to the Board: After a brief discussion to not formally form any committees until all the board members can be present. Director Layne made a motion to accept the Committees Policy. Director Voboril seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.
- 15. Pace Engineering, new Principle Engineer for CPUD: GM Motzkus stated that our current Engineer, Ed Anderson wants to retire. He asked the board to allow him to get into Contract with Pace. Pace is also the Engineer for American Valley and East Quincy. The first step of the permit is Work Order #1. They will start a study to find Chester's disadvantaged rating. If our rating is "Severely Disadvantaged", then we may qualify for 100% of the grant. Director Voboril made a motion to allow GM Motzkus to get into Contract with Pace as well as allowing Pace to be our principle engineer. Director Layne seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.
- 16. Investment Committee Update: by Frank Motzkus: Our checking earned 1612.93 for the year. The 400K CD earned 958.94 its first quarter. The Plumas Bank accounts will stop sweeping between each other. The savings will now be a Money Market, to earn .35%. This is better than the .10% is was earning. No Action taken.
